Curriculum Aims: in this unit children will explore the question- Why is family an important part of Hindu life?

Prior Learning: An understanding of different religions and their traditions

Vocabulary **Facts** 1. Beliefs & Values Hinduism, dharma, duty, debts, Raksha, develop an understanding of the importance of duty and Bandhan commitment to many religions b. know that following dharma (religious duty) is an important part of Hindu life c. suggest the impact of belief in dharma, particularly the belief that there are three 'debts' - duty owed to God/the deities, duty owed to teachers, and duty owed to family Living religious traditions describe how and why Hindus might celebrate Raksha Bandhan b. identify aspects of the celebration which remind Hindus of their dharma c. identify religious teachings contained within a Hindu story – and suggest how these stories might be used to teach Hindu children about dharma (eg. What teachings about duty to family are expressed in the story of Rama and Sita?) 3. Shared human experiences a. identify sources of authority and inspiration b. consider what our 'duties' as human beings are Search for personal meaning a. reflect on their own duties – to themselves, to their families, to

- their communities
- b. discuss who or what they follow and why
