




Key stage 1, year B

RE – Hindu dharma 1

Curriculum Aims: This unit gives children the opportunity to explore the Hindu concept of one God (Brahman) who can be understood and visualised in many forms. This unit should build on their prior learning about the use of symbolism to express religious beliefs. Children should be able to talk about how images of the deities in Hinduism are a visual representation of beliefs about God. Children should also have opportunities to think about the complexity of identity and how people may be seen in different ways according to their role and relationship. There will be opportunities for children to develop self-awareness of their own identity and roles.

Prior Learning: They know about similarities and differences between themselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions. Children will have explored simple representations of other faiths and celebrations in EYFS.

<p>4. Search for personal meaning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) reflect on how others might see them b) talk about the different roles that they might have (friend, child, brother/sister etc.)
