






From top to bottom: 1898 - Lewis Carroll died aged 66 (with a photo of his grave); 1865 - Alice in Wonderland was published (with the book cover); 1861 - Lewis Carroll had a photography studio (with a photo of a camera lens); 1861 - Lewis Carroll became a Deacon (with a stained glass window); 1856 - Given the pen name Lewis Carroll (with a portrait); 1832 - Charles Dodgson was born in Daresbury Park (with a map of Daresbury Park).</p>
